Sharing backstory is tricky, though. Share too much information, or share it before readers care about your characters, and your readers will likely lose interest.

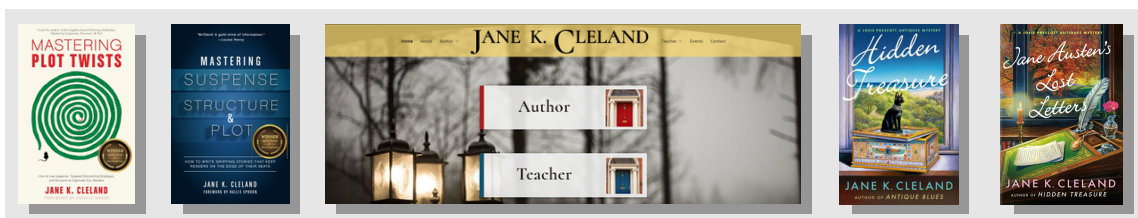
